

On going projects

Stormwater drainage around the soccer shed.

Local contractors, Glen North and Wayne Bogg are carrying out the earthworks required to prevent flooding problems at the western end of the soccer shed.

Street Verge Gardens along The Palisade

The oaks and banksias have been planted between The Palisade verge and the Five Villages' Community Garden to soften the area and to attract birdlife. More plantings have taken place near the south side and eastern side of the playground fence. This work has been done by volunteers from the Yulunga Reserve committee.

Improvement of the Soccer field

The eastern end of the soccer field is being cleared of some weeds and wattles and a contractor, Summit Services, will be there this week to grind any stumps to make the area safe to mow.

There will be more soil spread on the northern bank of the oval to reduce the slope and allow for it to be more easily mown.

Replacement tree plantings

A couple of trees had to be removed to allow the community garden to be constructed and council requires replacement trees to be planted. So 3 Bangalay Gums have been already planted along the soccer field embankment and there are 3 more still to be planted.

The volunteers on our committee have enjoyed working with the volunteers on the Five Villages' Garden committee in beautifying the area between the soccer shed and hall which was once a degenerated area.

Greg organised, with a committee, an information session in the hall prior to the referendum and the framed copy was presented to the community at that event.
