Preparing the hall for the proposed extension

The acoustic panels on the interior western wall have been removed in preparation for the extension works. The window curtains have also been taken down. We have noticed that the hall now has much poorer acoustics, so these improvements have made a difference to the hall. The underfloor storage has also been emptied. The architect, Ray Jones, requested we complete these tasks as the DA is supposedly close to approval. These items will be reinstalled once the building project is completed.

Our committee initially worked with council on finding possible alternative venues for the mobile pre-school but ongoing responsibility for negotiations now is the responsibility of the RHVA executive who are the project managers.
