5. GENERAL BUSINESS

• Update on illegal beach camping communication with Council

- recent RHVA email communication with the ranger in charge at Council, Jodie Parnell, following 2 letters to Council re the community's concerns about illegal beachside camping. Council will continue to work with the RHVA to improve Council's response to the matter ahead of upcoming holiday periods.

Action – Secretary to provide Council with updated list of beaches impacted

• All - abilities access to local beaches

- RHVA wrote to Council to request action to provide all-abilities access to local beaches eg Washerwomans. Council not planning to include such works in current schedule. Letter written also to Liza Butler who replied that she will continue to provide support for Council action

• Successful NSW grant application for fishing tables

- Michelle Ricciardi – Michelle informed the meeting that RHVA was successful in obtaining an \$8,000 grant from the Dept of Primary Industry for replacing the fishing tables at Boat Harbour. Will work with the fishing club on implementation

• Progress on Disaster Ready Fund Round 3 funding application for Yulunga Hall build stage 2

- Michelle Ricciardi and Kerry Moore updated the meeting on the submission by RHVA to the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) for a grant to

complete stage 2 of the Yulunga Hall extension. The NSW Reconstruction Authority has informed the RHVA that our application has been supported by the NSW Government and will wait for final decision by the Australian Government later this year.

- concern raised by Jenny Chopping that some community members do not think that the hall extension is required. They believe the hall is large enough for the community's needs.

'RHVA undertakes consultation with community members which may include undertaking a survey. The consultation will aim to refamiliarise the community with the reasons for the hall extension and the efforts made by the RHVA and Yulunga Reserve Committee to progress the extension to date, and to listen to any community members' concerns'.

6. Any other business

Concerns about increase in wombat deaths along Bendalong rd and road safety risk for RFS volunteers due to current 80km speed zone

- Sue Westaway raised ongoing community concerns about increased roadkill along Bendalong Rd esp. wombats. Some discussion in the meeting about specific signage to be erected, however there are already a number of relevant signs along Bendalong and Inyadda rds, and more can be obtained through MMEA if required.
- Dennis Buttigieg asked the RHVA if we could support a request to Council to reduce the speed level from 80km to 60km from around the RFS station entry to the start of the 50km speed zone at Bendalong village. Concerns raised for safety of RFS volunteers exiting and entering Bendalong Rd at current speed level. Additional recommendation that reduced speed also apply to Inyadda drive to reduce impact on animals.
- Reminder from Margaret Rasmussin that grass verges along Bendalong Rd still not slashed by Council despite notification that this would happen back in May. **Resolution** moved by Dennis Buttigieg

Seconded by Richard Pearson

'RHVA writes to Council to request serious consideration of speed limit reduction from 80kms to 60kms from just west of the RFS station on Bendalong Rd to the 50km speed zone at entry to Bendalong village. Speed limit reduction also to extend to Inyadda Dr. RHVA additionally reminds Council that the grasses verges must be slashed along Bendalong Rd in line with their earlier commitment. Both actions would improve general motorist and animal safety, and the safety of RFS personnel'.
